

A Quick Look at Statistics



- Estimated 20 40 million people in modern slavery.
- Traffickers earn \$150 billion/yr \$99 billion/yr is from commercial sexual exploitation.
- 71% of enslaved people are women and girls; men and boys account for 29%.
- Over half of the criminal human trafficking cases in the US involved children.
- Many child sex trafficking survivors were at one time in the foster care system.
- Growing trend of traffickers using online social media to recruit and advertise.
- Average age is between 12 and 14 years old.
- Many victims are runaways who were sexually abused as children.

Human trafficking is the illegal exploitation of a person.












Who are the Traffickers





There is no single profile of a trafficker

They are men AND women Individuals and part of a larger crime group

Part of every social, racial, and ethnic group

Recruiting

Targets vulnerable individuals and professes false love and attention

Grooming

Breaks them down emotionally through manipulation and coercion, humiliation, and physically through violence


Total Control of Mind & Body

Keeps all or most money from their work all strip clubs, escort services, street walking, truck stops, massage parlors, hotels, or brothel-like organizations

Where are the Traffickers





Trafficker Use of Social Media Platforms Growing

Traffickers look for posts like:

"Nobody gets me."

"I am so ugly."

"My life sucks."

"She's not my true friend."

"My parents don't trust me."

"I'm being treated like a kid."

"I need to get out of here."

Traffickers strategically respond like:

"I understand you."

"I love you."

"I think you're beautiful.

"I'll make your life better."

"I'll protect you."

"I'll make you successful."

Social Media also Used to Advertise

- Several advertising and sales sites browsed by "johns/sugar daddies,"
- Examples: Cityxguide, Skipthegames, Bedpage, Seekingarrangement.com and sugar-babies.com.
- Williamson said Bedpage is a spin-off of Backpage, which was the focus of a 2017 documentary called "I Am Jane Doe" about the fight against child sex trafficking online.

Heightened Concerns with Large Events









- In 2008 when the DNC was in Denver, there was at least a 29 percent jump. In Minneapolis for the RNC that year, there was at least a 47 percent increase in paid sex ads. Milwaukee Journal Sentinel 7/16/19
- Group warns of sex trafficking spike during U.S. Open TMJ4 6/7/17
- Super Bowl show a large spike in host city and in other cities. In January 2019, there were approx. 450 reported incidents with a jump to approx. 540 in February. Institute for Sport and Social Justices' Shut Out Trafficking program.



Who are the Victims/Survivors





There is no single profile of a victim

Vulnerable Individuals

1 in 3 runaways are approached by a sex trafficker within 48 hours of running away

In Need

In need of love, attention, or even shelter, food, clothing, they are vulnerable to the offers coming from a trafficker if they are the first to help

Coerced/Forced Prostitution

With a 'chain around their neck', they cannot break away due to confinement, humiliation, shame, dependency, and hopelessness



Pornography is Major Gateway Issue

Widespread access and addiction fuels objectification of women and ultimately a desire to pay for an experience

Widespread access and addiction fuels victims forced into pornography

Clicking porn directly fuels the demand for sex traffickers to make money by selling video of their sex slaves to porn sites.

Porn is harmful in a lot of ways. Mainly because it addicts the brain, kills love and intimacy in relationships, and is inseparably linked to sex trafficking. Check our site for more!

Drug Trade is Connected But Also Differs

Traffickers may attempt to use drugs as a means of control and coercion

Drugs may be a form of payment in trafficking

Traffickers may also target individuals with drug issues or who are in drug corriders

Drug trade looks similar in some cases

- Being primarily cash business
- Conducted by individuals, gangs, or organized criminal organizations

Differs in the methods of attack and perception

- Victimization of the trafficked individuals is incorrectly focused
- 'Johns' list may influence conviction and ability to get to the top trafficker






